Survey on Exhibitions Held in 2019— 20 Businesses and 71 Organizations Held over 600 Exhibitions during the Year

Until now, the Japan Exhibition Association (JEXA) has announced figures for exhibitions held by JEXA member organizers (businesses or organizations) the previous year.

These figures, however, do not present the full picture, and in order to obtain data closer to the actual figures for the number of exhibitions held in Japan, this fiscal year we contacted the organizers (of which 51 businesses and 96 organizations are JEXA members) of 770 exhibitions listed the "Japan Exhibition Handbook" published by POP Inc..

Although this is our first attempt at this type of survey, 7 businesses and 62 organizations which are not JEXA members participated, and we were able to collect information on 603 exhibitions, a great increase over the 407 exhibitions recorded in our "Survey of Exhibitions Held in 2018," giving us a clearer picture of exhibitions that took place in Japan.

Going forward, we hope to gain the understanding and cooperation of more parties, in order to make our survey the basic data for Japan's exhibition industry, and we look forward to your continued support and encouragement.

A summary of survey findings follows below.

1. Total no. of exhibitions: Organizers held an average of 6.6 exhibitions each

In total, 603 exhibitions were held, of which 388, or 64%, were organized by JEXA members. Non-JEXA members organized 215 exhibitions, or 36% of the total. An average of 6.6 exhibitions were organized per organizer.

2. Total exhibition floor area: 21,200 square meters or more per organizer

Total exhibition floor area was 1,935,151 square meters. Exhibitions organized by JEXA members covered 1,171,422 square meters (61%), while the corresponding figure for non-JEXA members was 763,729 square meters (39%).

Average exhibition floor area by organizer was approximately 21,200 square meters or more.

3. Total no. of exhibitors: 19% were from overseas; 23% were domestic

The total number of exhibitors was 77,041.

As shown in the survey findings broken down by overseas and domestic exhibitors (see below), in some cases there was no response, and therefore the totals for domestic and overseas exhibitors do not correspond.

There were 62,907 exhibitors, domestic and foreign, but domestic exhibitors numbered 51,114, or 81% of the total.

Domestic businesses or organizations accounted for 23% of exhibitors, while exhibitors from overseas numbered 11,793 (19%), indicating that exhibitions in Japan are gradually broadening their appeal to overseas exhibitors.

4. No. of visitors: Visitors were overwhelmingly from Japan

The total number of visitors was 7,490,484.

As shown in the survey findings broken down by overseas and domestic visitors (see below), visitors totaled 3,619,085. In some cases, surveyees did not respond, and therefore the totals for domestic and overseas exhibitors do not correspond.

Domestic visitors numbered 3,467,072, 96% of the total, while there were 152,013 visitors from overseas, 4% of the total. Visitors were thus overwhelmingly from Japan.

5. By category: Most exhibitions fell into the B-to-B category

There were 565 B-to-B exhibitions (93.7%), 17 B-to-C exhibitions (2.8%), and B-to-BC exhibitions (3.5%). These figures show that most exhibitions fell into the B-to-B category.

6. By month: 12% of exhibitions took place in November, the most popular month

November was the most popular month, with 74 exhibitions (12%), followed by February, January, October and May.

7. By venue: Nearly half of all exhibitions were held at Tokyo Big Sight

Tokyo Big Sight was the venue for 296 exhibitions, accounting for 49% of the total, followed by Makuhari Messe, INTEX OSAKA, Porte Messe Nagoya and Marine Messe Fukuoka.

8. By city: More than half of all exhibitions took place in the special wards of Tokyo

315 exhibitions (52%) were held in the special wards of Tokyo, followed by the cities of Chiba, Osaka, Nagoya and Fukuoka.

9. International exhibitions: Slightly over 10% were international exhibitions

Of the 603 exhibitions held in 2019, 62 were international exhibitions, as defined by ISO 25639-13.3* * Under ISO 25639-13.3, international exhibitions are defined as those in which a considerable number of exhibitions and/or visitors are from outside the country hosting the exhibition.

Note: Generally speaking, "a considerable number" is defined as 10% in the case of exhibitors from overseas, and 5% in the case of visitors from overseas.

10. By exhibition floor area, no. of exhibitors and no. of visitors

(1) By exhibition floor area: 10.6% of exhibitions held in Japan covered a floor area of from 10,000 to under 15,000 square meters

The largest number, 23, covered a floor area of from 10,000 to under 15,000 square meters.

64 exhibitions (30%) covered a floor area of from 2,000 to under 6,000 square meters, while 50 (23%) covered a floor area of from 10,000 to under 25,000 square meters.

(2) By no. of exhibitors: Just over 50% of exhibitions held in Japan had from 50 to under 300 exhibitors. The largest number of exhibitions, 44, had from 100 to under 200 exhibitors.

113 exhibitions (53%) had from 50 to under 300 exhibitors.

(3) By no. of visitors: 14% of exhibitions held in Japan had from 10,000 to under 15,000 visitors

The largest number, 30, had from 10,000 to under 15,000 visitors, followed by 25 with from 15,000 to 20,000 visitors, and 14 each had from 20,000 to 25,000 visitors and from 25,000 to under 30,000 visitors, respectively.

We note that one exhibition attracted over 300,000 visitors.
